## Food Guide: Rangoon Road - HungryGoWhere Singapore

From quirky cafes to old-school bak kut tehs and Korean bingsu, here's our food guide for best eats along Rangoon Road

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OLD SCHOOL BAK KUT TEH | Ng Ah Sio Bak Kut Teh

Mr Ng Siak Hai's father started selling his peppery Teochew-styled Bak Kut Teh in the 1950s around the present-day River Valley and Hill Street vicinity. In 1977, Mr Ng (nicknamed Ng Ah Sio) took over the business, boosted the peppery profile of the soup, and opened Ng Ah Sio Pork Ribs Soup Eating House at New World Amusement Park (Current Kitchener Road). And the rest, as they say, is history. The fame of his invigorating Bak Kut Teh drew the crowds and among them, celebrities, local politicians and foreign dignitaries. The eatery settled down at its current address in 1988 and in January 2010, it was taken over by JUMBO Group. Besides the Bak Kut Teh (from \$6), Braised Pig Trotters (\$9) and Teochew Braised Duck (\$10 per portion) are also well received.
